TEMPORARY TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDERS 2024 (NORWICH)
Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984

Norfolk County Council in exercise of its powers under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, hereby give notice that:

(i) THEY PROPOSE TO MAKE Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders in respect of the following roads:

FARROW ROAD - (northbound carriageway only) from its junction with Earlham Road to its junction with Bowthorpe Road to facilitate surface dressing and lining works between 19:00 and 06:00 from 18th to 30th May 2024 for the duration of the works only while signs indicating the closure are in place expected to be 2 separate nights within the period. Alternative route is via: Earlham Road, Unthank Road, Convent Road, Grapes Hill, Dereham Road, Guardian Road.

NEWMARKET ROAD – from its junction with Camberley Road to its junction with Daniels Road Roundabout to facilitate resurfacing, stud and lining works by Norfolk County Council from 20th May to 8th June 2024. Alternative route is via: Southbound route; Daniels Road, Ipswich Road, A47, A11 Newmarket Road. Northbound route; Daniels Road, Ipswich Road, A47, A11, Newmarket Road (Norwich, Cringleford, Keswick and Intwood, Caistor St. Edmund and Bixley, Ketteringham).

WESTWICK STREET CYCLE LANE - from 45m west of its junction with Charing Cross for 10m westwards to facilitate gas works from 20th to 22nd May 2024. Alternative route – St Benedicts Street.

(ii) THEY HAVE MADE Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders in respect of the following roads:

BURY STREET - from its junction with Unthank Road to its junction with Newmarket Street to facilitate lead water mains replacement works. The road will be temporarily closed (except for access) and traffic will be temporarily prohibited from parking, stopping and loading/unloading vehicles from 17th May to 28th June 2024. NB. Parking restriction will run for the same time period and will cover the same length of road as the road closure. Restriction required to prevent vehicles parking within works area. Alternative route is via: Unthank Road, Mount Pleasant, Newmarket Street and vice versa.

WALDECK ROAD – 1) Waldeck Road from 130m south-westwards of its junction with Mile End Road to its junction with Leopold Road; **2) Waldeck Road** from its junction with its junction with Mile End Road for 130m south-westwards; **3) Waldeck Road** from its junction with Mile End Road to its junction with Leopold Road; and **4) Mile End Road** (south-west bound) onto Waldeck Road to facilitate new water supply connection works. The road(s) 1) will be temporarily closed (except for access); 2) will be temporarily subject to a suspension of the one-way restriction (southbound); traffic using the road 3) will be temporarily prohibited from parking, stopping and loading/unloading vehicles; and 4) will be temporarily subject to a no right turn restriction from 14th to 16th May 2024. Alternative routes is via: 1) Waldeck Road, Mile End Road, Unthank Road, Leopold Road; 2) Mile End Road (southbound), Mile End Road (northbound).

WINCHCOMB ROAD AND BRIAR COURT - 1) Winchcomb Road (westbound) onto Guardian Road and **2) Briar Court (eastbound)** onto Guardian Road to facilitate gully and chamber clearance works. The roads 1) and 2) will be temporarily subject to a no right turn

restriction from effect between 21:00 on 13th May and 06:00 on 14th May 2024. Alternative routes are via: 1) Guardian Road, Farrow Road, Earlham Road/Colman Road roundabout, Farrow Road and Guardian Road and 2) Guardian Road, Dereham Road/Sweet Briar Road Roundabout and Guardian Road.

Unless otherwise stated, the effect of these Orders will be to prohibit the use by vehicles of the named road(s). All other restrictions are included where necessary. In the event of the start date being delayed the new start date will be displayed on site in advance. Alternative routes are shown where applicable and pedestrian access will be maintained at all times. If necessary, the restrictions could run for a maximum period of 18 months from the date of the Orders or 6 months in respect of footpaths, cycle paths, bridleways, restricted byways, and byways open to all traffic (BOAT).

Penalty: £1000 maximum fine on conviction and/or endorsement for contravention.
