Norfolk County Council TEMPORARY TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDERS 2024 (NORWICH) Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984

Norfolk County Council in exercise of its powers under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, hereby give notice that:

(i) THEY PROPOSE TO MAKE Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders in respect of the following roads:

DEREHAM ROAD - from its junction with Guardian Road to its junction with Bowthorpe Road to facilitate carriageway rejuvenation works from 13th to 14th June 2024 (may continue until 26th July 2024). Alternative route is via: Dereham Road, Old Palace Road, Heigham Street, Mile Cross Road, Drayton Road, Sweet Briar Road and vice versa.

LAKENHAM ROAD - from its junction with Hall Road Roundabout to its junction with Ipswich Road to facilitate carriageway rejuvenation works from 13th to 14th June 2024 (may continue until 26th July 2024). Alternative route is via: Ipswich Road, Hall Road and vice versa.

PRINCE OF WALES ROAD - Prince of Wales Road from its junction with Upper King Street to its junction with Recorder Road ("Road A"); Prince of Wales Road from its junction with Upper King Street to its junction with Eastbourne Place ("Road B"); Cattle Market Street from its junction with Rouen Road to its junction with Rose Lane (northbound only) ("Road C"); Market Avenue from its junction with Cattle Market Street to its junction with Agricultural Hall Plain ("Road D") and; St Vedast Street from its junction with Prince of Wales Road to its junction with Road Lane ("Road E") to facilitate carriageway rejuvenation treatment works, the Roads A, C and E will be temporarily closed/restricted (except for pedestrian access); traffic will be temporarily prohibited to park, stop or load/unload over Road B; and Road D shall be temporarily subject to the suspension of the bus lane which is anticipated to be between 06:00 and 12:00 on the 9th June 2024 (may continue until 21st July 2024). Alternative route is via: Upper King Street, Tombland, Palace Street, St Martin At Palace Plain, Whitefriars, Barrack Street, Bishop Bridge Road, Riverside Road, Riverside, Koblenz Avenue, Carrow Road, King Street, Rouen Road.

SHIPFIELD - from 50m south of its junction with Blakes Court for 25m southwards to facilitate new water connection works from 10th to 12th June 2024 (may continue until 24th July 2024). Alternative route is via: Shipfield, Denton Road, Clabon Road, Wall Road, Sprowston Road.

SPEKE STREET - from its junction with Hotblack Road to its junction with Livingstone Street to facilitate new water connection works from 10th to 12th June 2024 (may continue until 24th July 2024). Alternative route is via: Livingstone Street, Dereham Road, Hotblack Road.

ST STEPHENS ROAD - from its junction with St Stephens Road/ Chapel Field Roundabout to its junction with Westlegate to facilitate carriageway rejuvenation treatment works from 19:00 on 12th to 06:00 on 13th June 2024 (may continue until 25th July 2024). Alternative route is via: Chapel Field Road, Chapel Field North, Theatre Street, Rampant Horse Street and vice versa.

(ii) THEY HAVE MADE Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders in respect of the following roads:

BRIAN AVENUE - from 185m east of its junction with Trafford Road to 40m north of its junction with Patricia Road to facilitate new water main connection works from 5th to 7th June 2024, but may continue until 19th July 2024. Alternative route is via: Brian Avenue, Cecil Road, Trafford Road.

GRAPES HILL BUS LANE - from its junction with Dereham Road to its junction with Chapel Field Road Roundabout to facilitate carriageway rejuvenation works. The Road will be subject to the temporary suspension of the Bus Lane for the duration of the works from 18:30 on 3rd to 07:00 on 4th June 2024, but may continue until the 16th July 2024.

HALL ROAD & LAKENHAM WAY - 1) Hall Road Footbridge from its junction with Mansfield Lane to its junction with St Johns Close; and 2) Lakenham Way Cycle Way from its junction with its access ramp to St Johns Close for 172m southwards to facilitate footway deck repair works from 3rd to 7th June 2024, but may continue until the 19th July 2024. Alternative route is via: 1) pedestrians will be required to use available crossing and opposite footpath; and 2) Access ramp to St Johns Close, St Johns Close, Hall Road, Mansfield Lane, Access Ramp to Mansfield Lane and vice versa.

ST JOHNS CLOSE (southeastern side of the carriageway) - from 119m east of its junction with Hall Road for 11m eastwards to facilitate footway deck repair works. Traffic will be temporarily prohibited to park, stop or load/unload from 3rd to 7th June 2024, but may continue until the 19th July 2024. Alternative route is N/A.

Unless otherwise stated, the effect of these Orders will be to prohibit the use by vehicles of the named road(s)/ footpath(s). In the event of the start date being delayed the new start date will be displayed on site in advance. Where an Order is for a reason other than works it is because of the likelihood of danger to the public or of serious damage to the road/footpath. **Anticipated dates are stated but the Orders may continue until the end date where necessary or required.** The Orders are revoked on the end date or on the actual date of removal of the prohibition/restriction where earlier without further notice. If necessary, the restrictions can have a maximum duration of 18 months for vehicular highway or 6 months for non-vehicular highway.

Penalty: £1000 maximum fine on conviction and/or endorsement for contravention.
