TEMPORARY TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDERS 2024 (NORWICH)
Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984

Norfolk County Council in exercise of its powers under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, hereby give notice that:

(i) THEY PROPOSE TO MAKE Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders in respect of the following road:

GROVE ROAD - from its junction with Victoria Street to its junction with Brazen Gate to facilitate gas main disconnection works from 15th to 19th July 2024 (may continue until the 30th August 2024). Alternative route is via: Grove Road, Southwell Road, Hall Road, Queens Road, Brazen Gate.

(ii) THEY HAVE MADE Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders in respect of the following roads:

GILBARD ROAD AND BEECHENO ROAD – 1) Gilbard Road from its junction with Beecheno Road for 30m southwards and **2) Beecheno Road** from 35m west of its junction with Gilbard Road for 50m eastwards to facilitate telegraph pole replacement on the 12th July 2024 (may continue until 23rd August 2024). Alternative route is via: Gilbard Road, Stevenson Road, Beecheno Road.

ST. FAITHS LANE - from its junction with Prince of Wales Road for 18m northwards to facilitate safety during development of an adjacent building from 6th July 2024 to 16th June 2025 (may continue until 6th January 2026). Alternative route is via: St Faiths Lane, Cathedral Street, Prince Of Wales Road.

Unless otherwise stated, the effect of these Orders will be to prohibit the use by vehicles of the named road(s)/ footpath(s). In the event of the start date being delayed the new start date will be displayed on site in advance. Where an Order is for a reason other than works it is because of the likelihood of danger to the public or of serious damage to the road/footpath. **Anticipated dates are stated but the Orders may continue until the end date where necessary or required.** The Orders are revoked on the end date or on the actual date of removal of the prohibition/restriction where earlier without further notice. If necessary, the restrictions can have a maximum duration of 18 months for vehicular highway or 6 months for non-vehicular highway.

Penalty: £1000 maximum fine on conviction and/or endorsement for contravention.
