Norfolk County Council TEMPORARY TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDERS 2024 (NORWICH) Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984

Norfolk County Council in exercise of its powers under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, hereby give notice that:

(i) THEY PROPOSE TO MAKE Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders in respect of the following road:

PEMBROKE ROAD - from its junction with Denbigh Road for 50m southwards to facilitate new electrical connection works from 24th to 30th September 2024 (may continue until 11th November 2024). Alternative route is via: Denbigh Road, Park Lane, Parker Road and vice versa.

(ii) THEY HAVE MADE Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders in respect of the following roads:

DENMARK AND GERTRUDE ROAD - 1) Denmark Road from its junction with Sprowston Road for 20m westwards and **2) Gertrude Road** from its junction with Sprowston Road for 20m eastwards to facilitate gas mains replacement works from 16th September to 4th October 2024 (may continue until 15th November 2024). Alternative route is via: 1) Denmark Road, Constitution Hill, Wall Road and Sprowston Road; 2) Gertrude Road, Mousehold Avenue, Silver Road and Sprowston Road.

ROSARY ROAD - from its junction with Chalk Hill Road for 50m southwards to facilitate Anglian Water valve and chamber repairs from 16th to 22nd September 2024 (may continue until 3rd November 2024). Alternative route is via: Riverside Road, Thorpe Road.

SANDRINGHAM ROAD - from its junction with St. Phillips Road for 30m eastwards to facilitate new water connection works from 17th to 19th September 2024 (may continue until 31st October 2024). Alternative route is via: Sandringham Road, Alexandra Road, Earlham Road, Edinburgh Road.

Unless otherwise stated, the effect of these Orders will be to prohibit the use by vehicles of the named road(s)/ footpath(s). In the event of the start date being delayed the new start date will be displayed on site in advance. Where an Order is for a reason other than works it is because of the likelihood of danger to the public or of serious damage to the road/footpath. **Anticipated dates are stated but the Orders may continue until the end date where necessary or required.** The Orders are revoked on the end date or on the actual date of removal of the prohibition/restriction where earlier without further notice. If necessary, the restrictions can have a maximum duration of 18 months for vehicular highway or 6 months for non-vehicular highway.

Penalty: £1000 maximum fine on conviction and/or endorsement for contravention.
