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LICENSING OBJECTIVES

Describe the steps you intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives:

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e)

List here steps you will take to promote all four licensing objectives together.

All staff including both directors have operated and been trained within licensed premises. New staff will be trained in relation to the sale of alcohol. Records will be kept at the premises and available to Police or Licensing Authority on request. A Personal Licence holder will be at the premises at all times when alcohol is being sold or regulated entertainment is being provided. We have a policy against the admittance of large groups, i.e. hen and stag parties. As a restaurant, we provide food that is available at all times when the premises are open. Free drinking water is available at all times when the premises are open. Free drinking water is available at all times when the premises are open.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Alcohol and soft drinks will be served in toughened glasses. Where glass bottles are used the contents will be decanted into toughened glasses. All bottles and glasses are to be removed from public areas as soon as the contents are empty. Bottle bins for collection or empty bottles will not be accessible to members of the public. Customers carrying open or sealed bottles or glasses will not be admitted to the premises at any time. We have a capacity limit of 14 to prevent overcrowding which could lead to crime and disorder. Irresponsible drinks promotions will not be permitted. We have an anti-drugs policy: any person found to possess or use drugs on the premises will be immediately removed and barred. All staff are aware of and communicate our "House rules" warning customers that if they act in an inappropriate manner they could be barred from the premises.

c) Public safety

All exit doors are easily operable without the use of a key, card, code or similar means. Exit doors are regularly checked to ensure they function satisfactorily. Access is provided for emergency vehicles and kept clear and free from obstruction at all times. Fire alarm tests are conducted weekly and an evacuation policy is in place. Adequate and appropriate First Aid equipment and materials are available on the premises and at least one suitable trained First Aider will be on duty when the public are present. In the absence of adequate daylight suitable and sufficient artificial lighting is provided and maintained in any area accessible to the public. The premises have current and suitable Public Liability Insurance in the sum of £5,000,000.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Doors and windows will be kept closed when regulated entertainment is taking place. Prominent, clear and legible notices

are displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly. Patrons will be prevented from taking open vessels of alcohol off the premises. The premises has a waste collection contract with Clean N Green who remove waste.

e) The protection of children from harm

The premises operates a proof of age policy (challenge 25); forms of identification that will be accepted are a valid passport, photo card driving licence, HM Forces identity card and a PASS accredited identification card. Children must be accompanied and supervised by an adult at all times and will not be admitted after 8pm.

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NOTES ON REGULATED ENTERTAINMENT

In terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
 - Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

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PAYMENT DETAILS
