Norfolk County Council TEMPORARY TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDERS 2025 (NORWICH) Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984

Norfolk County Council in exercise of its powers under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, hereby give notice that:

(i) THEY PROPOSE TO MAKE Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders in respect of the following roads:

MOUNT PLEASANT - from 47m northwest of its junction with Newmarket Street for 10m north westwards to facilitate manhole repairs on 8th April 2025 (may continue until 20th May 2025). Alternative route is via: Mount Pleasant, Unthank Road, Mile End Road, Newmarket Road. The works promoter is Anglian Water.

ST. ANDREWS STREET - from its junction with Duke Street for 185m eastwards to facilitate replacement works for electrical link box between 08:00 and 17:00 from 5th to 6th April 2025 (may continue until the 18th May 2025). Alternative route is via: Duke Street, A147 St Crispins Road/ Barrack Street/ Bishop Bridge Road/ Riverside Road, Prince of Wales Road, Rose Lane, Market Avenue, Bank Plain. The works promoter is UK Power Network.

(ii) THEY HAVE MADE Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders in respect of the following roads:

ANGEL ROAD & WATERLOO ROAD - 1) Waterloo Road from its junction with Buxton Road to its junction with Angel Road and **2) Angel Road** from its junction with Waterloo Road to its junction with Eade Rode to facilitate resurfacing works on 24th March 2025 (previously 19th to 23rd March 2025) (may continue until the 5th May 2025). Alternative route is via: Waterloo Road, Magpie Road, Botolph Street, Edward Street, St Augustines Street, Aylsham Road, Woodcock Road, Angel Road. Southbound - Angel Road, Woodcock Road, Aylsham Road, and Waterloo Road. The works promoter is Norfolk County Council.

CAERNARVON ROAD - from 85m north of its junction with Denbigh Road for 20m northwards to facilitate new water connection works from 1st to 3rd April 2025 (may continue until 15th May 2025). Alternative route is via: Denbigh Road, Wellington Road, Earlham Road, Caernarvon Road and vice versa. The works promoter is Anglian Water.

DENMARK AND SILVER ROAD - 1) **Denmark Road** from its junction with Sprowston Road for 10m westwards and 2) **Silver Road** from its junction with Sprowston Road for 10m south-eastwards to facilitate traffic signal upgrade works from 5th to 11th April 2025 (may continue until 23rd May 2025). Alternative route is via: 1) Denmark Road, Magdalen Road, Constitution Hill, Wall Road, Sprowston Road and vice versa; 2) Southeast bound - Sprowston Road, Magdalen Road, Bull Close Road, Charlton Road and Barrack Street. Northwest bound - Silver Road, Barrack Street, Barrack Street/Ketts Hill Roundabout, Barrack Street, Barrack Street/St Crispins Road Roundabout, Charlton Road Bull Close Road, Magdalen Road and Sprowston Road. The works promoter is Norfolk County Council.

WARWICK STREET - from its junction with Portersfield Road to its junction with Dover Street to facilitate lead replacement scheme works. The road will be temporarily closed, and vehicles shall be temporarily prohibited to park, stop, load from 31st March to 9th May 2025 (may continue until 9th

November 2025). Alternative route is via: Dover Street, Unthank Road, Park Lane, Avenue Road, Portersfield Road and vice versa. The works promoter is Norfolk County Council.

Unless otherwise stated, the effect of these Orders will be to prohibit the use by vehicles of the named road(s)/ footpath(s). In the event of the start date being delayed the new start date will be displayed on site in advance. Where an Order is for a reason other than works it is because of the likelihood of danger to the public or of serious damage to the road/footpath. **Anticipated dates are stated but the Orders may continue until the end date where necessary or required.** The Orders are revoked on the end date or on the actual date of removal of the prohibition/restriction where earlier without further notice. If necessary, the restrictions can have a maximum duration of 18 months for vehicular highway or 6 months for non-vehicular highway.

Penalty: £1000 maximum fine on conviction and/or endorsement for contravention.
