

Conservation Area 16 : Hellesdon Village

Hellesdon Hall Road

- 1-4 C19. 2 storeys red brick terrace. Slate roof. Dogtooth string course. Entrances under gabled porches, two at front, two at side. Casements.
- Hill House Farm C19. Range of farm outbuildings. Red brick and flint with pantile roof. Single storey.

Hellesdon Road

- Road Bridge 1819. Iron bridge over the River Wensum. Built by Norwich Corporation.
- 195 C19. 2 storeys, red brick detached cottage. Pantile roof. Cast iron casement windows to front recently re-leaded. Central door with decorative timber canopy.
- 197 C19. Single storey and attic. Red brick. Fish scale slate roof. Decorative red brick chimney. Dormer with timber finial. Cast iron lozenge window. Front door with lozenge glazing. Later extension to rear.

Hellesdon Lodge C19. 2 storeys red brick. Slate roof with gables. 1-storey entrance porch at side, with brick pilasters and finials and brick gable enclosing brick heraldic plaque. Moulded brickwork niche above. String course. Crenellated parapet and decorative brick cornice. 2-storey rectangular bay with casements. Pattern brick chimneys probably from Costessey Hall (demolished 1920s).
- Former Railway Bridge 'A' frame former railway bridge over River Wensum. Built in 1882 by either Barnard Bishop and Barnard, or Boulton and Paul. Constructed of riveted steel girders.

Hellesdon Mill Lane

- Mill (part of) 1851. Matthouse of Hellesdon Mill and attached buildings, now furniture depository. Main building 4-storeys, red brick. Slate roof. Shallow arches of white brick over square windows.

1-5 Mill Cottages	Mid C19. 2 storeys red brick terrace. Black glazed pantile roof. Single fronted. Georgian style door cases. 4-pane windows. Brick built flat roof porch to No. 5.
Sluice Bridge	C19. Red brick with blue capping stones. 4 brick arches. Original Mill stood on top.
Freresgate	C19. 2 storeys. Red brick. Pantile roof. 4 replacement windows. Entrance door to side.
