Contraventions relating to structural repairs, your food safety management system and staff training, should be completed within the next <u>2 months</u>.

Health and safety contraventions should be dealt with within 3 months unless otherwise stated.

To assist you the report may also include **Observations** of current practice, useful **Information**, **Recommendations** of good practice and reminders of **Legal Requirements**.

My inspection was not intended to identify every contravention of the law and only covers those areas, practices and procedures examined at the time of the inspection. If the report fails to mention a particular matter this does not mean you have necessarily complied with the law.

## 1. Food Hygiene and Safety

## 2. Structure and Cleaning

The structure facilities and standard of cleaning and maintenance are all of a good standard and only minor repairs and/or improvements are required. Pest control and waste

disposal provisions are adequate. The minor contraventions require your attention. **(Score 5)** 

## Maintenance

**Contravention** The following had not been suitably maintained and must be repaired or replaced:

• wall surfaces damaged

## Pest Control

**Recommendation** Ensure staff are trained to recognise the signs of pests and that they undertake regular checks of the premises.

**Recommendation** Provide a plan showing the location of all the baiting points and/or traps in and around the building.

**Recommendation** Employ the services of a pest controller for internal parts of the building.

# 3. Confidence in Management

There are generally satisfactory food safety controls in place although there is evidence of some non-compliance with the law. You are progressing towards a written food safety management system. Your records are appropriate and generally maintained but some deficiencies were identified. The contraventions require your attention; although not critical to food safety they may become so if not addressed. (**Score 10**)

## Type of Food Safety Management System Required

**Legal Requirement** Food business operators must put in place, implement and maintain a permanent procedure or procedures based on HACCP principles:

- · Identify hazards to food
- Identify the critical limits (what is acceptable and unacceptable)
- Monitor critical control points to ensure critical limits are met
- Keep appropriate records to demonstrate control measures are effective

**Legal Requirement** Ensure that your food safety management system is available on site so your staff can refer to your procedures and so that daily records of checks can be completed.

# Proving Your Arrangements are Working Well

**Contravention** The following are needed in order to demonstrate your food safety management system is working:

 you were in the process of updating your old SFBB pack due to a change in your current business model from a food bank to producing cooked foods. I took your verbal assurance you will attend to this matter at the earliest opportunity

## Traceability

**Observation** Your records were such that food could easily be traced back to its supplier.

#### Allergens

**Observation** You had identified the presence of allergens in your non-prepacked food and had brought this to the attention of your customers.
