**What you must do to comply with the law**

The report may include **Contraventions** - matters which do not comply with the law . You must address all of the contraventions identified; failure to do so could result in legal action being taken against you.

As a guide, contraventions relating to cleaning, temperature control and poor practice, should be dealt with straight away.

Contraventions relating to structural repairs, your food safety management system and staff training, should be completed within the next 2 months.

Health and safety contraventions should be dealt with within 3 months unless otherwise stated.

To assist you the report may also include **Observations** of current practice, useful **Information, Recommendations** of good practice and reminders of **Legal Requirements**.

My inspection was not intended to identify every contravention of the law and only covers those areas, practices and procedures examined at the time of the inspection. If the report fails to mention a particular matter this does not mean you have necessarily complied with the law.

## FOOD SAFETY

### How we calculate your Food Hygiene Rating:

The food safety section has been divided into the three areas which you are scored against for the hygiene rating: 1. food hygiene and safety procedures, 2. structural requirements and 3. confidence in management/control procedures. ### 1. Food Hygiene and Safety

You have a good track record. There are some minor contraventions which require your attention. Your records are appropriate and generally maintained. **(Score 5)**

#### Contamination risks

**Contravention** The following exposed food to the general risk of cross-contamination with bacteria or allergens or its physical contamination with dirt, foreign objects or chemicals:

- a container of food was placed directly onto uncovered food below in fridge

**Legal Requirement** At all stages of production, processing and distribution, food must be protected from any contamination likely to render it unfit for human consumption, injurious to health or contaminated in such a way that it would be unreasonable to expect it to be consumed in that state.

#### Hand-washing

**Contravention** The following indicated that hand-washing was not suitably managed:

- no soap was available
- the wash hand basin was obstructed

**Legal Requirement** Wash hand basins must be provided with hot and cold running water and suitable drainage; soap and a hygienic way to dry hands.

**Legal Requirement** An adequate number of wash hand basins must be available for use, they must be suitably located and designated for cleaning hands.

### Personal Hygiene

**Observation** I was pleased to see that standards of personal hygiene were high.

### Temperature Control

**Observation** I was pleased to see you were able to limit bacterial growth and/or survival by applying appropriate temperature controls at points critical to food safety and that you were monitoring temperatures.

## **2. Structure and Cleaning**

The structure facilities and standard of cleaning and maintenance are of a generally satisfactory standard but there are some repairs and/or improvements which are required in order for you to comply with the law. Pest control and waste disposal provisions are adequate. The contraventions require your attention; although not critical to food safety they may become so if not addressed. **(Score 10)**

### Cleaning of Structure

**Contravention** The following items were dirty and require more frequent and thorough cleaning:

- ceiling
- floor wall junctions
- high level cleaning

**Contravention** The following items could not be effectively cleaned and must be covered, made non-absorbent or replaced:

- unsealed wooden structures

### Maintenance

**Contravention** The following had not been suitably maintained and must be repaired or replaced:

- tiles are broken, holed, chipped ungrouted or missing
- wall cladding damaged
- floor surfaces damaged

- wall surfaces damaged

### **3. Confidence in Management**

A food safety management system is in place and you demonstrate a very good standard of compliance with the law. You have a good track record. There are some minor contraventions which require your attention. Your records are appropriate and generally maintained. Your staff are suitably supervised and trained. **(Score 5)**

#### **Type of Food Safety Management System Required**

**Legal Requirement** Food business operators must put in place, implement and maintain a permanent procedure or procedures based on HACCP principles:

- Identify hazards to food
- Identify the critical limits (what is acceptable and unacceptable)
- Monitor critical control points to ensure critical limits are met
- Keep appropriate records to demonstrate control measures are effective

#### **Proving Your Arrangements are Working Well**

**Contravention** You are not working to the following safe methods in your SFBB pack::

- training records / supplier lists
- complete all safe methods within your Safer Food Better Business Pack. Do not leave them blank. If you do not do some foods i.e. chinese food write n/a (not applicable) in the un-completed safe method sheets

#### **Traceability**

**Observation** Your records were such that food could easily be traced back to its supplier.

#### **Waste Food and other Refuse**

**Observation** You had measures in place to dispose of waste food appropriately and were employing the services of an approved waste contractor.

#### **Training**

**Observation** I was pleased to see that food handlers had been trained to an appropriate level and evidence of their training was made available.
