#### What you must do to comply with the law

The report may include **Contraventions** - matters which do not comply with the law. You must address all of the contraventions identified; failure to do so could result in legal action being taken against you.

As a guide, contraventions relating to cleaning, temperature control and poor practice, should be dealt with <u>straight away</u>.

Contraventions relating to structural repairs, your food safety management system and staff training, should be completed within the next <u>2 months</u>.

Health and safety contraventions should be dealt with within <u>3 months</u> unless otherwise stated.

To assist you the report may also include **Observations** of current practice, useful **Information**, **Recommendations** of good practice and reminders of **Legal Requirements**.

My inspection was not intended to identify every contravention of the law and only covers those areas, practices and procedures examined at the time of the inspection. If the report fails to mention a particular matter this does not mean you have necessarily complied with the law.

# FOOD SAFETY

## How we calculate your Food Hygiene Rating:

The food safety section has been divided into the three areas which you are scored against for the hygiene rating: 1. food hygiene and safety procedures, 2. structural requirements and 3. confidence in management/control procedures. # 1. Food Hygiene and Safety

Food hygiene standards are high. You demonstrated a very good standard of compliance with legal requirements. You have safe food handling practices and procedures and all the necessary control measures to prevent cross-contamination are in place. Some minor contraventions require your attention. (Score 5)

## Contamination risks

**Contravention** The following exposed food to the general risk of cross-contamination with bacteria or allergens or its physical contamination with dirt, foreign objects or chemicals:

• uncovered prepared foods in walk in chiller.

**Legal Requirement** At all stages of production, processing and distribution, food must be protected from any contamination likely to render it unfit for human consumption, injurious to health or contaminated in such a way that it would be unreasonable to expect it to be consumed in that state.

#### Personal Hygiene

**Observation** I was pleased to see that standards of personal hygiene were high.

# 2. Structure and Cleaning

The structure facilities and standard of cleaning and maintenance are all of a good standard and only minor repairs and/or improvements are required. Pest control and waste disposal provisions are adequate. The minor contraventions require your attention. **(Score 5)** 

## Cleaning of Structure

**Contravention** The following items were dirty and require more frequent and thorough cleaning:

- around equipment feet
- floor wall junctions
- pipe work under wash hand basin
- door threshold have to rear door to outside
- vents to bulk.freezers

## **Maintenance**

**Contravention** The following had not been suitably maintained and must be repaired or replaced:

- work tops damaged or worn
- freezer lids
- missing/ damaged handles to bulk freezers

# 3. Confidence in Management

There are generally satisfactory food safety controls in place although there is evidence of some non-compliance with the law. Your records are appropriate and generally maintained but some deficiencies were identified. Some minor issues were identified relating to staff supervision and training. You have a satisfactory track record. The contraventions require your attention; although not critical to food safety they may become so if not addressed. **(Score 10)** 

## Type of Food Safety Management System Required

**Legal Requirement** Food business operators must put in place, implement and maintain a permanent procedure or procedures based on HACCP principles:

- Identify hazards to food.
- Identify the critical limits (what is acceptable and unacceptable).
- Monitor critical control points to ensure critical limits are met.
- Keep appropriate records to demonstrate control measures are effective.

# Proving Your Arrangements are Working Well

**Contravention** You are not working to the following safe methods in your SFBB pack:

• food allergies

- training records. Without staff training records being fully completed you have no evidence that staff had been trained on your food safety control measures as stipulated within the SFBB pack
- supplier lists

## **Traceability**

**Observation** Your records were such that food could easily be traced back to its supplier.

## Allergens

Contravention You are failing to manage allergens properly:

• You have not identified the allergens present in the food you prepare

**Legal Requirement** Caterers must provide allergy information on all un-packaged food they sell. Catering businesses include restaurants, take-away's, deli counters, bakeries and sandwich bars etc. The potential for cross-contamination by allergens must also be made known to consumers.
